## Presentation of the Draft FFY 2001-02 Federal Transit Administration (FTA) Section 5310 Elderly and Disabled Transit Program

### Summary:

Staff will present the Draft FFY 2002-03 Section 5310 Elderly and Disabled Transit Program List. Attached are the letter and draft Statewide Prioritized List of Projects as submitted to the Regional Transportation Planning Agencies and Applicants for the Elderly and Disabled Transit Program.

For the Federal FY 2002-03 Elderly and Disabled Persons Transit Program, the Regional agencies submitted 108 applications representing 316 projects. This represents a request for a total of \$14,661,080 in Program funds, forty-percent more than the amount of funds typically made available to California.

### Background:

The Elderly and Disabled Persons Transit Program was established in 1975 and has been administered by Caltrans since its inception. It provides annual grants of federal funds to purchase transit capital equipment to meet the specialized needs of elderly and/or disabled persons for whom mass transportation services are unavailable, insufficient, or inappropriate. A 20% local match is required from all Program participants. The Program, since its inception, has provided approximately 2,600 vehicles to serve a variety of client groups and programs ranging from small agencies with specific clientele (e.g., dialysis and AIDS patients) to paratransit providers serving entire communities. Most of these agencies are non-profit organizations while some are public agencies where no non-profit organizations are readily available to provide the proposed service.

In 1996, AB 772 passed directing the Commission to have oversight responsibilities for the Program. AB 772 placed three mandates on the Commission regarding the Program:

1. The Commission shall direct Caltrans on how to allocate funds for the Program.
2. The Commission shall establish an appeals process for the Program.
3. The Commission shall hold at least one public hearing prior to approving its Program of projects.

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In January of 1997, the Commission approved procedures and criteria for the program that utilize project scoring criteria and a State Review Committee consisting of representatives from the State Departments of Rehabilitation, Aging and Transportation, with Commission staff acting in the role of facilitator/coordinator for the State Review Committee.

In accordance with the Commission's adopted procedures, the Regional Transportation Planning Agencies (RTPAs) or its designated Regional Evaluation Committee score projects within their jurisdiction utilizing the Commission's adopted project scoring criteria and send a scored list of their projects to Caltrans. The RTPA must notify its applicants of their project scores and provide information about the local appeals process. Caltrans integrates the Regional lists into one statewide draft prioritized list and forwards it to the State Review Committee. The State Review Committee then reviews the list and based on the project scores calculated by the Regions, and in compliance with the Commission's adopted procedures, determines a "cutoff point" for project review by the Committee.

Typically, the Commission adopts the Program of Projects down to the 110% funding level to allow flexibility if projects higher up on the list are not completed. The current estimate of total available funding is approximately \$10.3 million. This puts the 110% of estimated available funding level at \$11.3 million (all of these figures include the required 20% local match less the 5% for administration).

Commission staff and the State Review Committee have scheduled a staff level conference for July 23, 2002, to hear any appeals by the Regions and/or project applicants. Depending on the outcome of the staff level conference some projects may be rescored. Once a final determination is made a statewide-priority list will be assembled and presented to the Commission at its August 2002 meeting, at which time the Commission conducts the mandated public hearing and may adopt the Program of Projects for FFY 2002-03.

## CALIFORNIA TRANSPORTATION COMMISSION

### TO: REGIONAL TRANSPORTATION PLANNING AGENCIES APPLICANTS FOR THE ELDERLY AND DISABLED TRANSIT PROGRAM

The Statewide Review Committee has reviewed the scored applications for the FY 2002-03 Elderly and Disabled Transit Program (Title 49 U.S.C. Section 5310) from the Regional Transportation Planning Agencies and, using the program criteria adopted by the California Transportation Commission, has developed the draft statewide prioritized project list (copy enclosed). In those instances where there would be a sizable difference in a region's funding level due to differences between Regional and Statewide Review Committee project scores the regions were contacted by Caltrans and the differences thoroughly discussed.

A staff level conference to discuss the draft statewide list has been scheduled for July 23, 2002, at 9:30 a.m. in the Caltrans Headquarters Basement Board Room, which is located in the basement of the California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) building, 1120 N Street, Sacramento. As a reminder, the purpose of this conference is to discuss the draft statewide prioritized list and hear any appeals on technical issues. Only appeals based on actions that occurred at the statewide level will be considered and the appealing agency, by letter to the State Review Committee, will have to demonstrate, using documentation from its original application, that the Commission's adopted program criteria were incorrectly applied by the statewide committee.

Approximately \$10.3 million in funding (including the 20% local share) is expected to be available for the federal FY 2002-03 cycle. Given this estimate, projects with a Statewide Review Committee score of 76 and above on the enclosed list would appear to be candidates for funding depending on the outcome of the July 23 conference. Please note that the 100% funding cut off has projects with scores of 76 above the 100% line and scores of 76 below the 100% line, the projects have been prioritized based on the Commission's adopted procedures for prioritizing projects. Also, in accordance with the Commission's adopted procedures and criteria for the Program, the Statewide Review Committee reviewed projects down through a regional score of 72 points (the point score within which the 110% of expected funding level fell). This is done to maintain the size of the project pool while still respecting the time available to the Review

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Committee and the level of resources available to administer the Program. As we have in the past, Commission staff will probably also recommend including projects down to a 110% level of available funding, on the Commission's final adopted list, to allow for some flexibility if projects higher up on the list are not completed. If you plan to make a documented technical appeal, you will need to call Caltrans at their toll free number (888) 472-6816 to schedule a speaking time. Each agency will be allowed a maximum of ten minutes for their appeal(s). You must also put the appeal in writing and mail it to the following address (you may also fax the letter or bring it to the conference):

After the conference, the Statewide Review Committee will revise the list as necessary, and Commission staff will submit the final statewide prioritized list to the California Transportation Commission. The Commission will hold its mandated public hearing during its August 21-22, 2002, meeting in Los Angeles to discuss the prioritized list and overall program policy. The Commission will then adopt the annual Elderly and Disabled Transit Program.
